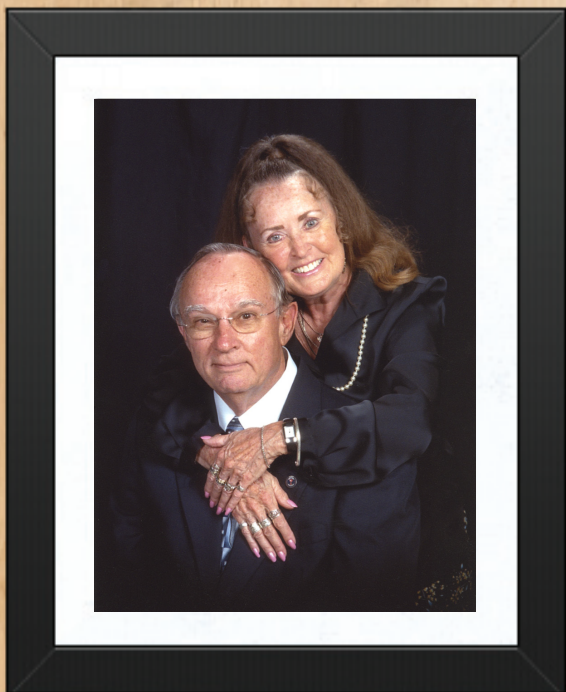


Leave a Legacy for Future Generations
